Refugees

Martha is involved as a volunteer in giving language lessons to refugees in our village. It is a very nice experience to help people step by step. Co-refugees from the same region are often needed to explain what is meant. Yet you see a lot of eagerness with these people to learn to

read and write and to master the (terribly difficult) Dutch language.

Alpha

In our previous newsletter we mentioned that we had been asked by Alpha Nederland to supporting an interdenominational group to start an Alpha in their village. We have been able to help them for a few evenings by giving tips and do a few "Alpha talks".

We could also start an Alpha at our home. We started with three participants in September. At first glance that does not seem like a large group, but the positive side of it was the greater mutual involvement and intimacy. It is always an impressive moment when you can witness that people are (literally) kneeling before the cross for the first time in their lives. All glory to God and to His Spirit! Will you pray that the seed that we were allowed to sow with this Alpha may continue to germinate?

Prophetic Huddel(s)

We also host a prophetic huddle at home. Martha leads the group in listening to God and we perform practical and challenging exercises. It is very beautiful to discover how God speaks; how this deepens your personal relationship with Father.

Martha has also been asked by Nederland Zoekt to lead a new huddle, this time via Skype. She was also asked if she would like to deepen her knowledge by joining the 3rd grade prophetic huddle that will start early next year.

It is also an opportunity to enter into deeper relationships, where we can show something that involves living with Jesus. That's why we always keep a "holy moment." A moment when we want to make a piece of the Kingdom visible. This can be done in all sorts of ways: sometimes we ask whether everyone comes up with an encouragement for the other or whether we offer a bible text to the participants. It is striking how everyone always seems to get the right Bible text ...


