
PRESIDENT'S CORNER

REACHING THE 98

Our Vision to Plant 30 Churches

Europe is in crisis today. According to Operation World, only 2.5% of Europeans identify as evangelical Christian. Pervasive social challenges betray this emptiness:

- 10 of the 13 highest global suicide rates are found in European countries and "Euthanasia tourism" is associated with medical tourism
- Magnificent cathedrals across Europe now sit largely empty
- Secularism has fragmented European family structures

These and other indicators reveal a deep internal need across the continent. As many as 98% of Europeans live apart from hope in Jesus. Evangelical Christians accounting for only 2.5% of Europe's population is not enough.

Transformation will occur through church planting. We believe planting healthy, adequately resourced, reproducing churches is the key to transformation. Europe desperately needs biblically based, evangelistically dedicated, and holistically focused churches. As ECMI participates in the training, care, and sponsorship of those leading these churches, the likelihood of long-term success dramatically increases. Well-equipped church planters, who are also well-supported, will plant and lead healthy, reproducing churches.

We believe there is hope for the 98%.

Scripturally centered churches are vital to holistic transformation among the peoples of Europe. Not only do we see these churches providing spiritual direction, but also being responsive to the wider range of human need. This is how we envision reaching the 98%.

We are a church planting ministry because the Church is the hope for Europe.

- Working with our European partners, we identify locations where churches are urgently needed
- From our relational network, we find capable people called by God to plant churches in these areas
- We invest in these church planters by giving them ongoing care, training, and continuing education
- We want to provide start-up funding to aid church planters as they launch their congregations

Together, we have a bold vision. A vison to plant 30 new churches in five years. A vision for churches to fill Europe's spiritual void. This is certainly beyond the scope of anything we have attempted before, but we believe God has led us to dream what seems impossible. We invite you to pray with us for this vision to be accomplished.

Octavian & Eugenia Verlan


Timisoara, Romania
