PRESIDENT'S CORNER



How ECMI-USA Aims to Care for Its Missionaries

The Search for God and Guinness (2014) recounts how Benjamin Lee Guinness led the famous family business in the mid-1800s. He was described as one who guided the company with kindness and maintained a friendly rapport with every worker connected to his brewery, even during a time of unprecedented growth. Benjamin Lee Guinness understood the way to get the best from employees was to ensure they were appreciated and cared for.



Valuing others is central to the Christian faith, and we purpose to care for our staff in a way which underscores this belief. My position was created precisely with this in mind, as my chief assignment is to connect our missionaries with an array of helpful resources.

We want you to know what Member Care at European Christian Mission International looks like now, and what we are working on for the near future.

Member Care occurs on two levels. Each of ECMI-USA's missionaries is under the care of a Member Care Facilitator based in Europe. These gifted men and women are ECMI colleagues trained to assist in various levels of care. Additionally, I am in contact with our field staff on a regular basis.

Pastoral Care is my role. For now, my interactions with our staff in Europe occur exclusively via video chat, WhatsApp messaging, and email. Of course, I look forward to visiting with our missionaries in person when European travel resumes. While I am comfortable providing pastoral care, I will avoid crossing into areas outside my expertise. This is why ECMI–USA is assembling a new team of service providers for our missionaries.

Wrap around services will be available soon.

We are currently in the process of enlisting skilled providers in areas such as counseling, health and nutrition training, financial advising, spiritual formation coaching, and medical consultation. These services will be made available via video, and ECMI–USA will provide initial sessions at no cost to our missionaries. Field staff have the option of funding ongoing services from their individual support account.

Your gifts play a part in the process. As a portion of every donation to ECMI–USA is allocated to operations, you help fund these member care efforts through your regular support of our missionaries and ministries.

Dimitrie & Maria Todorov


Burgas, Bulgaria
